Spring has Sprung—Building Permits & Code Enforcement

Now the spring is here, we know the home improvement and yard projects will be in full swing. Please be advised that some of these projects will need building permits. Also, the Town of Greensboro is located in a Critical Area, and some projects could include more than you think. Before you begin any projects or removal of trees please check in with Town Hall to make sure you are in compliance with all codes. Also, with the nice weather comes the normal yard maintenance of spring and summer. Remember, you will only get ONE grass warning a calendar year. Once you have received that letter, if you are in violation again, your grass will be mowed by the town. Thank you for helping us keep our town looking amazing.

Landlord/Tenant Payment Plans

The Town of Greensboro will be enforcing strict policy on how water/sewer bills are paid by landlords and tenants from this point forward. We do not control the agreement between the landlord/tenant on who pays the bill; however, the landlord is the one listed in our billing system. The tenant can chose to receive a copy of the bill, but they cannot put the account in their name. If a tenant is the one paying the bill, it must be PAID IN FULL by the due date. We will no longer be making payment arrangements with tenants, even with the landlord's permission. If payment arrangements need to be made after the due date, it will be the landlord's responsibility to make the arrangements and payments. Yard Waste Pick-Up/Bulk Pick-Up

Just a reminder, the Town of Greensboro has yard waste pick-ups on the 3rd Monday of every month. If you are trimming trees or bushes, please be sure that the brush is cut down to sections 4 foot or less to make it manageable for our Public Works Department. You can pile the brush neatly by the curb and we will pick it up from there. As for leaves, they must be in biodegradable bags which can be purchased at most hardware and home goods stores. We can not accept leaves in black yard or plastic bags. The company that we have pick up the yard waste from us will not take them in plastic bags. We also do not have the capability to pick up loose leaves. Also, our first Bulk Pick-Up for 2019 is scheduled for April 1st. Please make sure your bulk times are placed out front the night before so that they are not missed when Public Works comes around. Thank you for helping keep our town beautiful!
