Meeting called to order at 7:00 pm.

Entered Public Hearing for the Sale of 118 N. Main Street at 7:01pm.

Ordinance 2018-0-8: ORDINANCE NO. 2018-0-08

INTRODUCED BY: COMM. REICHART AT SEPTEMBER MEETING

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF GREENSBORO AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF PROPERTY LOCATED AT 118 N. MAIN STREET, DESCRIBED IN A DEED TO THE TOWN OF GREENSBORO, RECORDED AMONG THE LAND RECORDS OF CAROLINE COUNTY, MARYLAND AT LIBER 130, PAGE 87, CONSISTING OF 10,440 SQ. FT. FOR THE SUM OF \$50,000

Com. Mackey asked if we heard what they would be doing with the property. Mayor Noon stated that is was going to go back to tag and title, but that has not been confirmed.

Com. DeSimone motioned to accept Ordinance 2018-O-08 for the sale of 118 N. Main Street in the amount of \$50,000. Com. Wake seconded the motion. All in favor, motion passed.

KCI – Debbie Pfeil – Planning Services:

Debbie Pfeil did a brief presentation of her company and the services she could provide to the town. (PowerPoint of presentation attached.)

Mayor Noon thought that council may possibly need another workshop to discuss this. Ms. Delude stated that we need them mostly for the Comprehensive Plan and that Planning and Zoning needs to get ahead of this. Mayor Noon stated that he would want to see the numbers first. Debbie stated normally a Comprehensive Plan will cost a town between \$35K-\$70K over a few years. She stated that she advises towns to spread that over 2-3 budget cycles. Currently the State of Maryland isn't offering any relief, but her company has really been pushing it and if funding assistance becomes available if we were clients then we would be notified immediately. She also explained that Planning and Zoning would get two free scoping meetings to see how much we would need to do

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on our plan and how much we would need KCI's services before she would quote the town for their services but we would have to sign a contract to be an On-Call client.

Bridge Maxx:

Jim Conner spoke to council about his company putting an antenna on the Wheeler Drive water tower. Ms. Delude explained that he had proposed a lease of \$200 a month. Mayor Noon asked if they had better prices or services for our residents. Mr. Conner stated that the services were comparable to Comcast and Verizon. His company currently does internet and phone, with TV services coming soon. Mr. Reichart stated that the contract he had presented was pretty generic and the council agreed. The council stated that they would like to see a lot more information in the agreement, for example, terms and such. Once we receive it we will have the attorney look over it before it is signed. Com. Mackey motioned to accept the contract with Bridge Maxx once we received a more detailed contract including the term of 1 year and the pricing of \$200 for 1 antenna on the Wheeler Drive water tower. Com. Wake seconded the motion. Com. Wake, Mackey, DeSimone, Aye. Com. Reichart, Ney. Motion carried.

Sign:

Ms. Delude gave all the quotes and options to the council for them to look over. Mayor Noon asked each commissioner what they thought. Com. Mackey, Com. Wake, and Com. DeSimone stated they all liked the 2 sided sign from Signs by Tomorrow. Com. Reichart stated that he liked the 2 sided sign from Ober and felt it would be a better quality. A brief discussion ensued as to where to put the sign. The Mayor recommended we put a post on Facebook asking the public's opinion. Com. Mackey motioned to accept the quote of the 2 sided sign from Signs by Tomorrow. Com. DeSimone seconded the motion. Com. Wake, Com. Mackey, Com. DeSimone; Aye. Com. Reichart; Nay. Motion carried.

Town Manager Report:

Com. DeSimone motioned to close the Public Hearing. Com. Mackey seconded the motion. All in favor, motion passed.

Council Comments:

Com. Mackey wanted to go over the cost of KCI. Ms. Delude explained that \$5K puts us on as an on call client, but none of that money is used until we use them. It could be there 1 month or 10 years, it depends on how often we use them. Mr. Wake stated that he felt having them on call just made sense. Ms. Delude stated that with the dealings she has had with them she recommends them. Ms. Armour stated that she contacted a friend that did projects with them in Harrington and Milford and that they highly recommended Debbie and KCI. Com. Reichart motioned to sign the on-call agreement with KCI. Com. Mackey seconded the motion. All in favor, motion passed.

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Mayor Noon asked how Lighting of the City is coming along. Ms. Delude stated it was coming along and everything is right on track.

Com. DeSimone motioned to adjourn the meeting. Com. Mackey seconded the motion. All in favor, motion passed.
